MINUTES UNIVERSITY OF HOUSTON SYSTEM BOARD OF REGENTS ACADEMIC AND STUDENT SUCCESS COMMITTEE

In accordance with a notice being timely posted with the Secretary of State and there being a quorum present, Chair of the Committee, Carroll Robertson Ray, called the meeting to order.

AGENDA ITEMS

1. Approval of Minutes – Item B

On motion of Regent Blair, seconded by Regent Wilson and by a unanimous vote, the following minutes from the meeting listed below was approved:

2. Promotion in Academic Rank – University of Houston System – A&SS-1

Dr. John Antel, Senior Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs and Provost requested Board approval for faculty promotion recommendations to be effective September 1, 2010 from the University of Houston, University of Houston-Clear Lake, University of Houston-Downtown, and the University of Houston-Victoria. Dr. Antel stated that after a rigorous review is completed, the Provost recommends promotions to the Chancellor, who in turn makes recommendations to the Board. The Provost also described in detail the process for recommending faculty promotions. A listing of the recommended faculty promotions for each university within the system was addressed.

On motion of Regent Blair, seconded by Regent Wilson and by a unanimous vote, the Promotion in Academic Rank – University of Houston System was approved by the

committee. This item will be presented at the Board of Regents meeting on August 17, 2010 for final Board approval.

3. <u>Faculty Emeriti Appointments – University of Houston, University of Houston-Clear Lake,</u> and University of Houston-Downtown – A&SS-2

Dr. John Antel requested Board approval for faculty emeriti appointments at the University of Houston, University of Houston-Clear Lake and University of Houston-Downtown. The emeritus title is only conferred upon retired tenured faculty who have made a significant contribution to the university through a long and distinguished record of scholarship, teaching and/or service. Emeriti faculty are expected to remain willing to assist and advise the university as requested, particularly in their areas of expertise. Below is a listing of the emeriti appointments:

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On motion of Regent Blair, seconded by Regent Wilson and by a unanimous vote, the Faculty Emeriti Appointments for the University of Houston, University of Houston-Clear Lake and the University of Houston-Downtown was approved by the committee. This item will be presented at the Board of Regents meeting on August 17, 2010 for final Board approval.

4. 2010 – 2011 Staff Holiday Schedule – University of Houston System – A&SS-3

Dr. Antel requested Board approval of the 2010 - 2011 staff holiday schedule for university staff.

On motion of Regent Blair, seconded by Regent Wilson and by a unanimous vote, the 2010 – 2011 Holiday Schedule - University of Houston System was approved by the committee. This item will be presented at the Board of Regents meeting on August 17, 2010 for final Board approval.

5. <u>Approval of appointment of Interim Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost</u>, University of Houston-Downtown – A&SS-4

Dr. Antel introduced this item and requested the committee approve and ratify the appointment of Michael Dressman as Interim Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost at the University of Houston-Downtown pursuant to Board Policy 57.10. The effective date of his appointment was July 1, 2010.

On motion of Regent Blair, seconded by Regent Wilson and by a unanimous vote, the Approval of Michael Dressman as Interim Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost, University of Houston-Downtown was approved by the committee. This item will be presented at the Board of Regents meeting on August 17, 2010 for final Board approval.

6. <u>Approval of appointment of Vice President of University Advancement and External Affairs</u>, University of Houston-Downtown – A&SS-5

Dr. Antel requested the committee approve and ratify the appointment of Johanna Wolfe as Vice President for University Advancement and External Affairs at the University of Houston-Downtown pursuant to Board Policy 57.10. The effective date of her appointment was August 2, 2010.

On motion of Regent Blair, seconded by Regent Wilson and by a unanimous vote, the Approval of Johanna Wolfe as Vice President for University Advancement and External Affairs, University of Houston-Downtown was approved by the committee. This item will be presented at the Board of Regents meeting on August 17, 2010 for final Board approval.

7. Approval of appointment of Interim Vice Chancellor/Vice President for Research and Technology Transfer for the University of Houston System/University of Houston – A&SS-6

Dr. Antel requested the committee approve and ratify the appointment of Stuart A. Long as Interim Vice Chancellor/Vice President for Research and Technology Transfer pursuant to Board Policy 57.10. The effective date of his appointment was July 6, 2010.

On motion of Regent Blair, seconded by Regent Wilson and by a unanimous vote, the Approval of Stuart A. Long as Interim Vice Chancellor/Vice President for Research and Technology Transfer for the University of Houston was approved by the committee. This item will be presented at the Board of Regents meeting on August 17, 2010 for final Board approval.

8. <u>Approval of delegation of authority to Chancellor or her designee to certify to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board that the University of Houston System Board of Regents has approved degree or certification program.</u>

Dr. Antel stated the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board now requires a certification form signed by a university's Board of Regents or its designee certifying that the regents have approved a degree or certification program. Dr. Antel requested approval to delegate authority for this signature requirement to the Chancellor or her designee.

On motion of Regent Blair, seconded by Regent Wilson and by a unanimous vote, the Approval of delegation of authority to the Chancellor or her designee to certify to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board that the University of Houston System Board of Regents has approved degree or certification program was approved by the committee. This item will be presented at the Board of Regents meeting on August 17, 2010 for final Board approval.

9. New Master of Science Degree in Petroleum Completion and Well Intervention Engineering at the University of Houston – A&SS-8

Dr. Antel stated the University of Houston proposed the establishment of a Master of Science degree in Petroleum Completion and Well Intervention Engineering to be administered by the Department of Chemical and Biomolecular Engineering within the Cullen College of Engineering. This 36-hour program helps to address severe talent shortages that exist in the exploration and development sectors of the region's energy companies; and is designed to be completed within two calendar years and features both a thesis and non-thesis option. This program will utilize existing faculty resources, four adjuncts and three new proposed positions that will be hired in the next two years. Their teaching responsibilities will be shared between all programs currently offered in Petroleum Engineering.

On motion of Regent Blair, seconded by Regent Wilson and by a unanimous vote, the New Master of Science Degree in Petroleum Completion and Well Intervention Engineering at the University of Houston was approved by the committee. This item will be presented at the Board of Regents meeting on August 17, 2010 for final Board approval.

10. New Master of Science Degree in Petroleum Well Design Engineering at the University of Houston – A&SS-9

Dr. Antel stated the University of Houston proposed the establishment of a Master of Science degree in Petroleum Well Design Engineering to be administered by the Department of Chemical and Biomolecular Engineering within the Cullen College of Engineering. This 36-hour program is designed to be completed within two calendar years and features both a thesis and non-thesis option. Job market data and information provided by major oil and gas companies indicate a strong current demand for specially trained well design engineers.

On motion of Regent Blair, seconded by Regent Wilson and by a unanimous vote, the New Master of Science Degree in Petroleum Well Design Engineering at the University of Houston

was approved by the committee. This item will be presented at the Board of Regents meeting on August 17, 2010 for final Board approval.

11. <u>Report on Fall 2010 Opening of the University of Houston-Clear Lake Pearland Campus – University of Hosuton-Clear Lake – A&SS-10</u>

Dr. Antel introduced Bill Staples, President of the University of Houston-Clear Lake, who presented this item to the committee. A hand-out was distributed which provided the members of the committee with a brief history of the development of the University of Houston-Clear Lake (UHCL) Pearland Campus. Dr. Staples stated the UHCL Pearland Campus shares its premier, 30,659 square foot modern facility with the Pearland Economic Development Corporation, which occupies 8,043 square feet. A nationally accredited, upperlevel university, UHCL partnered with the City of Pearland to bring career-building higher education to the Pearland community. Through the UHCL Pearland Campus, area residents will have access to exceptional academics and professionally active faculty. Students will be able to complete junior, senior, and graduate courses in high-demand disciplines such as business, education and psychology. The university's space includes classrooms, a library, a student lounge, teaching labs, offices, and a faculty suite.

Dr. Antel introduced Elwyn Lee, Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs, who presented this item to the committee. Dr. Lee presented the committee with a powerpoint presentation entitled "UH On-Campus Housing Update." Summarized below is the current campus housing data for reference:

Total Expenditures 2009 vs. 2010 July year-to-date: \$70,565,645 / \$78,836,701 (12% increase)

Total IDC Recovery 2009 vs. 2010 July year-to-date: \$10,517,480 / \$12,860,293 (22% increase)
